PAM: Parent Access Module is part of SIMON our communication module. Medical updates, attendance, permission forms and other important information will be posted on PAM.

SCHOOL GROUNDS/MAINTENANCE

Thanks to Katherine Jamieson and Kerry Morse for caring for our chooks. Our carpets and windows were cleaned by Ky Cleaning, several maintenance tasks were attended to by Simon Fraser. Kennedy Landscaping weeded and topped up the sandpit. There was some damage done to our hall over the holidays with 4 broken windows.

ITC update:

We have begun a new lease for laptops for our senior students. There have also been some new I pads with keyboards for the junior school. We have been lucky to have 1:1 devices for the past 8 years and each year we attempt to add to the technology resources.

All classes will have a bootcamp session to ensure that all students have a thorough understanding of their responsibilities and privileges while using the ICT. Parents pay an ICT levy of \$100 per student and all students have the access to the latest technology devices.

GRADE 4/5/6 USB STICKS AND HEADPHONES

All students will require a set of headphones for use in class. The senior students will require a USB.

SUNSCREEN

Due to an increase in students with allergies, we would prefer if all students used their own sunscreen.

We do however, have sunscreen at school for students to apply before outside breaks. A sunscreen with a SPF50 is recommended.

SCHOOL FEES

The 2019 school fee letter will be sent home shortly. Georgia has developed a table whereby payments can be made weekly, fortnightly, monthly, by term or annually. Parents and carers are encouraged to see Mrs Fraser asap if you are having difficulty meeting the fee commitment.

UNIFORM

Jewellery:

The following items of jewellery may be worn – one watch, ear studs or sleepers (no pendant earrings)

Bracelets, rings, chokers and heavy metallic pendants are inappropriate.

Grooming:

Students are expected to maintain high standards of personal grooming and neatness, and to take pride in their school uniform. Hair ribbons and headbands should be navy blue or checked blue and white only. Extremes of hairstyle or colour will not be tolerated.

Coloured nail polish, lipstick and eye make-up are NOT permitted. Students will be asked to remove nail polish if it is worn to school. All long hair needs be tied back.

PARENTS & FRIENDS

This is a fundraising group who meet for a 'cuppa' and chat. It is a great way to meet people and will really make you feel part of what is happening at your child's school. Pre school children are most welcome to come along.

It is extremely important that this social, fundraising group is supported by all as the funds raised assist in purchasing resources for your children's education and for assisting in meeting the school financial commitments.

CLASSROOM HELPERS

Classroom helpers are encouraged. Helpers need to have a Working with Children Check which the school can assist with. All classes have expressed the wish to have parent/carer reading helpers.

STUDENTS STATIONERY LIST

Please ensure that your child has commenced the school year with the required stationery. If you need a new list of stationery requirements or assistance with the stationery, please contact the school. It has been posted on our facebook page.

CAR PARK

When entering and leaving the carpark, please be mindful of other vehicles and pedestrians. The teacher on duty will walk the students to the tennis court gate and we request that all parents collect their child/ren from the gate. This means getting out of your car and walking to your child/ren. NO child is to walk through the car park without an adult.

We also ask that all cars are parked facing the south (bush) and that they leave via behind the school hall.

This is to alleviate the busyness of the Hume St entrance.

STUDENTS WALKING AND RIDING HOME

Students who are walking home or riding will leave the school via the gate near the basketball court in Southam St. It is recommended by Vic Roads that children under 10 do not ride or walk to and from school without adult supervision. This is also our school policy.

WORLD DAY OF PRAYER, REFLECTION AND ACTION AGAINST HUMAN TRAFFICKING

Pope Francis designated 8 February, the feast of St Josephine Bakhita, as the World Day of Prayer, Reflection and Action Against Human Trafficking.

Learn:

St Josephine Bakhita was born in Darfur, Sudan in approximately 1869. Josephine was born into a well respected, comfortable and loving family. When Josephine was eight years old she was kidnapped by slave traders, who forced her into slavery.

Josephine's final owner was an Italian diplomat. Whilst he did business across the Middle East Josephine staying in Italy with the Canossian Sisters, working as a nanny. During this time, she came to know Jesus; she recognised that true freedom and hope come from him, and that he offers fullness of life to all people,

Italy did not recognise slavery and so finally Josephine was free. After being baptised in 1890, she joined the Canossian Sisters in 1893. AS an African woman with a deep sense of compassion and experienced in slavery and oppression, Josephine was able to help and advise the Sisters who were going to serve in Africa.

St Josephine Bakhita was canonised 1 October 2000 by Pope St John Paul II and is the Patron Saint of Sudan, South Sudan and trafficked people.

Prayer:

Saint Josephine Bakhita,

You remained strong and brave through years of slavery. You used your knowledge and experience in helping to prepare Sisters who were going to work in Africa. your gentle manner brought peace and strength to all.

Help us to have courage when times are hard; help us to be strong and supportive to anyone in need; help us always to remain close , as you were, to Jesus, and show love to all. Amen

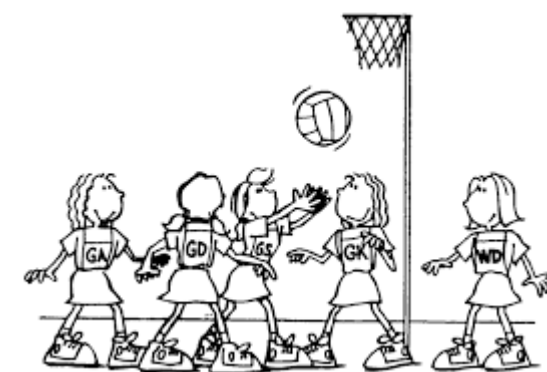

Children's Chatter Matters!

Language Learning activities to have a go at home.



Ten activities will be provided during term 4 focusing on pragmatic language skills. Pragmatics refers to the social use of language and includes what we say, how we say it, our body language and whether it is appropriate to the situation.

7. Discuss feelings and emotions and encourage the use of words rather than actions. Model sentences to your child e.g. I can see you're upset because... Give examples and provide reasons e.g. That makes me feel because.... Try to use a range of different vocabulary such as excited, embarrassed, upset, confused.

8. Try to communicate with your child without using words. It will be important to use facial expression and body language.



9. Encourage your child to order their own drink or food from a café. They will need to greet the waiter/ waitress, request their items and end the exchange appropriately with thank you.

10. Language is used for a huge range of purposes. Has your child had a chance to practice all of these this week:

Ham, cheese and veggie bake

This veggie bake is a great dinner recipe that also doubles as a delicious lunch!

makes: 8 | prep: 0:15 | cook 0:40



ingredients

- 20 g Western Star Original Salted Butter
- 1 onion (chopped)
- 1 cup zucchini (grated)
- 1 cup carrot (grated)
- 1/4 cup corn kernels
- 4 slice ham (deli) (chopped)
- 1 cup tasty cheese (grated)
- 6 eggs (beaten)
- 125 g self-raising flour

method

1. Preheat the oven to 180°C, and then melt the butter in a medium fry pan over a medium heat. Add the onion and cook for 4-5 minutes or until the onion softens and starts to smell yummy! Transfer into a large bowl to cool.
2. Once cooled, add all the other ingredients to the bowl. Use a big wooden spoon to mix everything together. Pour the mixture into a greased and lined 28x20cm tin.
3. Transfer the tin into the oven for 30 minutes or until the bake has puffed up and is golden. Remove from the oven and cool for five minutes before cutting into eight big squares.
