ADVENT

Next Sunday December 2nd, Christians will recognize the beginning of Advent.

Advent begins 4 weeks before the Celebration of Christmas and is a time of preparation for the coming of the Christ Child. In the midst of the pre-Christmas flurry, it's easy to lose sight of the profound spiritual importance of the Advent season.

It's important to balance the sacred part of the Advent season with all of the other things you are doing. If you don't make time for quiet reflection, prayer and conversion of heart, you will find yourself physically, emotionally and spiritually fatigued by Christmas Day.

The word Advent derives from the Latin word meaning coming. The Lord is coming. We may reflect that every year at this time we celebrate his coming, so that in a sense we can lose the

feeling of expectancy and joyful anticipation, because at the end of the season, everything seems to return to pretty much the same routine. If that is the case, then our preparation may have been lacking and we have therefore been robbed of much of the true meaning of this season.

During Advent we recall the history of God's people and reflect on how the prophecies and promises of the Old Testament were fulfilled.

This gives us a background for the present. Today we can reflect on the past track record of God and so begin to understand what it means to us now for the sake of what is to come, in our own future and that of our world.

HEAD LICE / NITS

Cases of head lice have been reported at St Mary's School. Head lice are common in school-aged children and are the most adaptable of creatures.

They have survived living solely on humans for 10,000 years. You may be reassured to know that they are commonly found in places other than St Mary's School.



The good news...

We know where they live and we know how to find them.

If you follow these steps, once a week, the control of head lice in your home will be greatly improved.

Step 1 - Comb inexpensive hair conditioner on to dry, brushed (detangled) hair. This makes it difficult for lice to grip the hair or run around.

Step 2 - Wipe the conditioner from the comb onto a paper towel or tissue.

Step 3 - Look on the tissue and on the comb for lice and eggs.

Step 4 - If lice or eggs are found, the child should be treated.

Step 5 - If the child has been treated recently and only hatched eggs are found, you may not have to treat since the eggs could be from the old infection.

If your child has head lice – tell anyone who has had head to head contact with them and ask them to check their family for head lice.

Children's Chatter Matters!



Language Learning activities to have a go at home.

Ten activities will be provided during term 4 focusing on pragmatic language skills. Pragmatics refers to the social use of language and includes what we say, how we say it, our body language and whether it is appropriate to the situation.

3. Turn-taking not only during games but also conversation is an important skill to master. Play games with your child to practice turn-taking (and also how to win or lose appropriately!). The following games are classics: Beetle, Guess Who, Pop-up pirate, Connect4, Trouble, Monopoly, Cluedo. You might need to give the verbal prompt, 'My turn', 'Your turn' for a start. Then focus on turn-taking during a conversation.
4. Each day when you pick your child up from school, use a different greeting e.g. Hi Harry, it's so great to see you, Good afternoon, Harry, Harry, I've missed you so much, etc.

See if your child can use a different greeting each day also.

Alternatively try using a different farewell e.g. see you later Harry, goodbye, Have a great day etc.

5. Take turns when eating dinner for family members to share one piece of information about their day. Encourage everyone to respond with either a comment or by asking a question.



Make sure that when each member is asking a question they; say the person's name and look at them directly. For example; Matt, how did you go at footy training today?

6. We can communicate so much by the way we say something. See if you and your child can say the following sentence in different ways to change the underlying meaning: "Oh, you've had a haircut". You can sound surprised, amused, jealous etc. by putting the emphasis on different words and using different intonation.

Some reminders:

1. Remember to sit beside your child when at the meeting and encourage him/her to discuss the questions.
2. Arrange a prayer focus for each meeting ie. cloth, candle, bible, symbols.
3. Read the chapter for the week before the meeting and be prepared, bringing any items suggested.
4. This is your special time with your child. You are your child's first faith educator.
5. Revise the chapter with your child during the week before the next meeting.
6. Make sure that you enjoy the time meeting other families on the same faith journey.

WASTE PIONEERS PROGRAM ST MARY'S, RUSHWORTH

The Program

The Waste Pioneers Program was developed by Veolia, in collaboration with Campaspe Shire Council, to provide waste education in an informative and engaging way for schools in the Shire of Campaspe and Moama council areas. The 6-week program commenced at the start of Term 3 2018 with a presentation from Veolia on correct waste disposal and why it's so important to put things into the correct bin.

The Pitch was introduced to the school and the challenge was for students to create an innovative solution and/or business proposal to a 1.25 litre PET bottle, which is the most commonly disposed of item at Veolia's Materials Recovery Facility (MRF) in Echuca. The MRF collects council's kerbside recycling bins and sorts it into similar materials, which are baled and then sent off to different locations for recycling.

The students attended an excursion to the MRF to learn more about recycling, followed by The Pitch to a panel of judges.



The Pitch

A major component of the Waste Pioneers Program is The Pitch. The challenge was for students to put their creative hats on and create a solution to PET bottles.

Students presented to a panel of three judges and the judging criteria were: Creativity, Innovation and Presentation. Each category had a total of 5 points for a total of 15 points per judge.

Prizes

The prizes for the winning schools are:

- 1st Place - \$2,000 of Veolia services
- 2nd Place - \$1,000 of Veolia services
- 3rd Place - \$500 of Veolia services

NewTecPoly in Moama also donated a raised garden bed made out of e-wood to the winning school. E-wood is made from 99% recycled electronic waste, which is then formed into a wood-like product.

Our School

Our school participated in the Waste Pioneers Program and we had 17 students attend the excursion to the MRF.

Our pitch was hanging planter 'boxes' made from PET bottles. We decorated the bottles with bright colours and added string to it so that it can be hung anywhere. These are great for growing herbs or flowers and help to brighten up any room.

We scored 35.5 out of 45 total points.
